The international magazine *Visioni LatinoAmericane* invites authors to send original and unpublished articles that propose critical and reasoned reflections on current events in Latin America.

The transitions taking place in many Latin American countries towards different and contradictory horizons mark a new phase, compared to the previous one, characterized by expansive social policies mainly run by left or center-left governments. Some countries such as Argentina, Brazil, Bolivia, Chile, Ecuador, Peru, Uruguay, Venezuela, can be considered, in their specificities and differences, real case studies of these transitions and reversal trends. Socio-political, economic and institutional processes and changes that seem to lead to new social, educational, institutional and management configurations of the places of development, democracy, participation and civil society.

Open-subject essays are also welcome.

Languages: all Latin American languages, Spanish and Portuguese, plus English and Italian.

The scheduled date for submission is April 25, 2021. Articles must range between 6,000 and 7,000 words and they must be in Word format (Body 12). A summary of no more than 50 words in Italian, English and Spanish and 5 keywords in Italian, English and Spanish must be included.
